## Tall buildings and the South East:

## Small, medium, large and extra large

## **Introduction:**

Date: 26 May 2004

Venue: The Old Ship Hotel, Brighton

Taller Building proposals are coming forward in increasing numbers, in areas not previously considered likely to develop them and raises the question of their place in the South East context.

In the right place, tall buildings can make a positive contribution to urban life and can affect the image and identity of an area as a whole. Yet, by their very scale, tall buildings can have far wider impact than intended and can also harm the qualities that people value about a place. In many cases, one of the principal failings is that many were designed with a lack of appreciation or understanding of the context in which they were to sit.

March 2003 saw the publication of the CABE and EH Guidance on Tall Buildings that provided advice on general approaches and principles. In response a small number of SE local authorities have produced their own guidance to meet their specific needs.

This conference provided an opportunity for local authority politicians and policy makers to learn from the experiences of others who are already meeting these challenges, and in particular asked these questions:

- Is taller better in the SE context?
- How do we avoid repeating the mistakes of the past?
- How should we assess these important and complex proposals in the finer grained SE context?

The proceedings of this conference will contribute to a publication being prepared by the **architecture centre** as part of the Building in Context Toolkit, an English Heritage South East regionally funded programme supporting delivery of better design solutions in historic areas across the South East. The conference was delivered in partnership with SEEDA and the South East Regional Design Panel, with support from Brighton and Hove Council.
